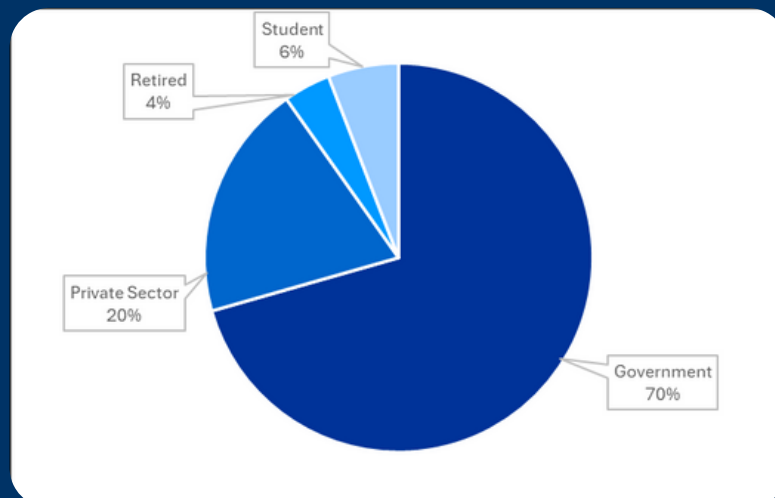
## THE CENTRAL INDIANA CHAPTER

To all new members of the Central Indiana Chapter of AGA—welcome! And to our returning members, thank you for your continued support and dedication.

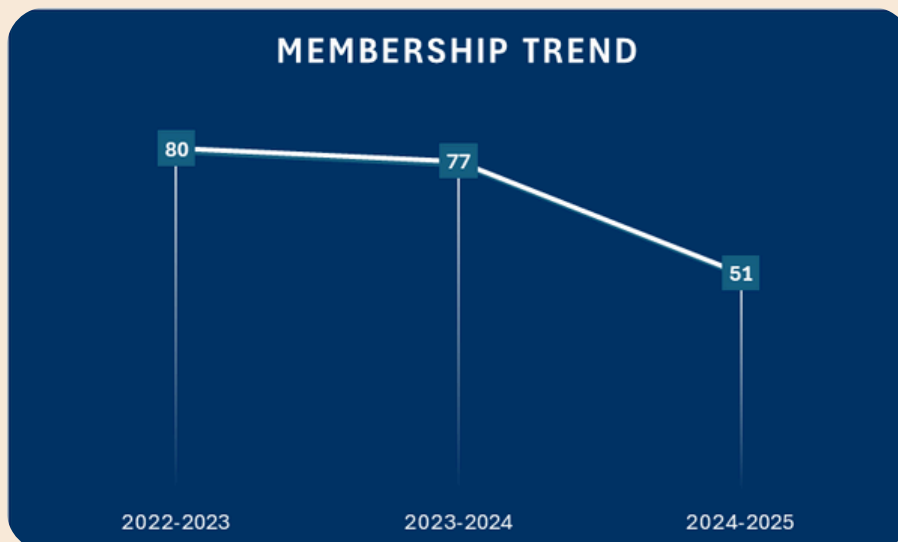

As shown in the chart below, membership declined by 34% over the past two years, largely due to professional turnover and broader shifts in the workforce. In response, we're prioritizing outreach, engagement, and visibility to rebuild our base.

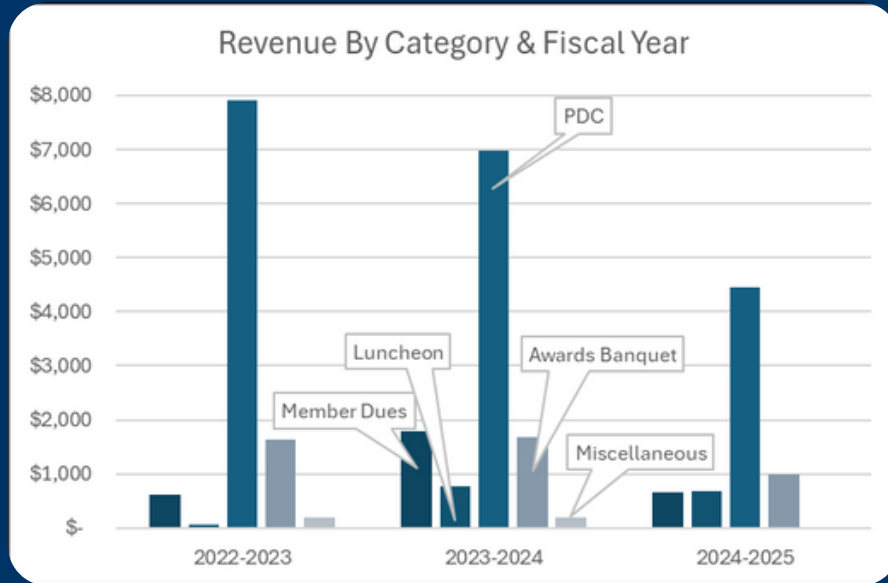


### MEMBERSHIP TREND



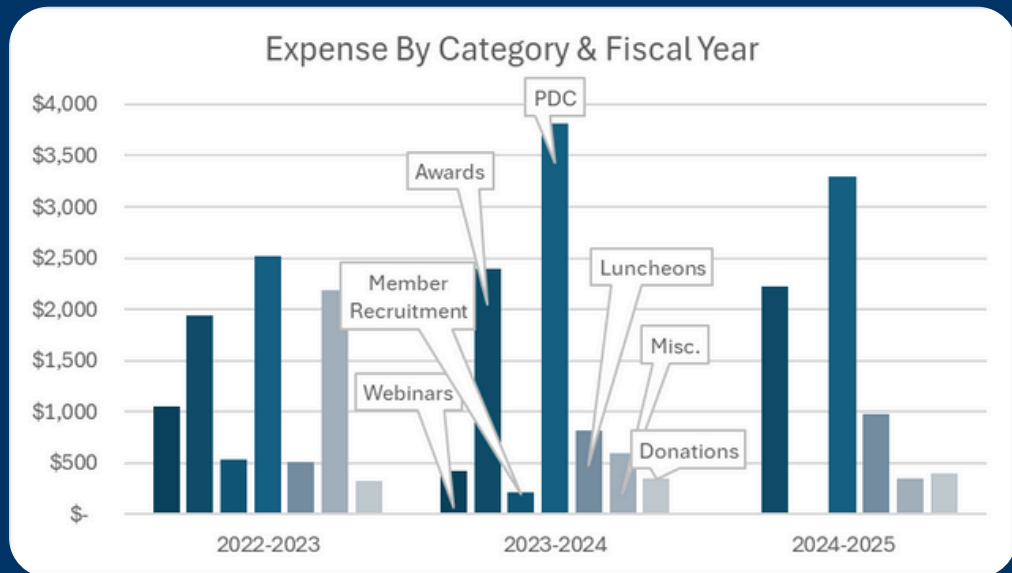
# Financial Footprint

## Revenues



In FY2024–2025, Chapter revenues declined to \$6,818, primarily due to reduced PDC and Awards Banquet income. This followed a brief, overall increase in 2023–2024 and reflects ongoing participation and economic challenges. These shifts highlight the need for continued strategic adjustments to ensure long-term financial stability. An audit of revenues is currently underway

## Expenses



In FY2024–2025, the Chapter reduced expenses in areas such as PDC, Webinars, and Awards in response to lower projected revenue. These adjustments helped stabilize financial health and support sustainable operations. An audit of expenses is currently underway
